

NATIONAL UNEMPLOYMENT FRAUD SCHEME

Be Aware, Report Fraud, Protect Yourself

Criminal enterprises using stolen personal information from earlier national data breaches have been attempting to file fraudulent unemployment claims.

If you believe someone has filed unemployment insurance in your name, you need to report it immediately:

1. Report the fraud to your Human Resources (HR) department or employer.
2. File a Police Report with your local police department. Depending on the state, the agency may want to get the fraud report from you.
3. Visit [IdentityTheft.gov](https://www.identitytheft.gov) to report the identity theft to the Federal Trade Commission and get step-by-step recovery help.
4. Check your cyber security
5. Review your credit report
For the next year, you can check your reports every week for free through [Annualcreditreport.com](https://www.annualcreditreport.com). This can help spot new fraud quickly.

Unemployment agency will not charge fees, and requests for SSNs/Bank Info via emails/texts/calls or surveys!

- Double authentication to your My HR Dashboard –Employee Self Service Portal to secure your personal information.
- Immediately reporting fraudulent claims received to your state's unemployment agency.
